MOTION NO. **7604**

A MOTION authorizing the King County Executive to make a grant application to the Washington State Department of Ecology for funds in the approximate amount of \$744,381 to support a business and industry recycling council in King County.

WHEREAS, King County has adopted solid waste management policies which establish waste reduction and recycling programs as basic elements of King County's solid waste management system, and

WHEREAS, King County has adopted a goal of reducing and recycling the waste stream by sixty-five percent by the year 2000, and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a Recycling Council, in cooperation with the chambers of commerce throughout King County, would provide an appropriate forum to address the challenges of commercial sector recycling, and

WHEREAS, implementation of a comprehensive recycling technical assistance program to provide information and education to businesses and industries on improving waste reduction, recycling, and procurement practices will result in a significant reduction of the waste stream, and

WHEREAS, Phase I of the Department of Ecology's Waste Reduction and Recycling Grant Program, funded through RCW 43.83A and 43.99F, provides for the award of grants by the Department of Ecology for demonstration project grants, and

WHEREAS, the council of King County recognizes an obligation to provide the amount of \$248,127 as a required cash match in support of this program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application to the Department of Ecology for funds in the approximate amount of \$744,381 for a comprehensive commercial and business recycling technical assistance program in King County;


B. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor;

C. The King County executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project;


D. The Dpeartment of Ecology is hereby assured of full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
