A MOTION declaring April 7-14, 1990 Community Development Week celebrating the Community Development Block Grant Program in King County.

WHEREAS, the federal Community Development Block Grant Program has operated since 1974 to provide local governments with the resources required to meet the needs of persons of low- and moderate-income, and

WHEREAS, the King County Community Development Block Grant Consortium, hereinafter referred to as the "the Consortium," has over the past sixteen years received eighty-three million dollars in Community Development Block Grant entitlement funds from the federal government through adoption and administration of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, hereinafter referred to as the "Act," and

WHEREAS, the Consortium is unique in that it is an urban county composed of twenty-seven suburban cities and unincorporated areas having a large low- and moderate-income population, which is both concentrated in highly urbanized areas as well as dispersed throughout a sizeable rural area, and

WHEREAS, the Community Development Block Grant funds received by the Consortium have been used to provide needed housing, capital improvements, community facilities and critical public (human) services to improve living conditions in the neighborhoods and communities throughout the Consortium where low- and moderate-income people live, and

WHEREAS, the proportion of Consortium Community Development Block Grant funds directly benefiting low- and moderate-income persons far exceeds that required by the Act, and

WHEREAS, King County recognizes that funding for the Community Development Block Grant Program has been significantly reduced since 1980, yet the problems of low- and moderate-income people have increased, and

WHEREAS, the week of April 7-14, 1990 has been designated by Congress as "National Community Development Week" to give special thanks and recognition to all participants whose hard work and devotion to the neighborhoods and their low- and moderate-income residents help ensure the quality and effectiveness of the Community Development Block Grant Program;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The week of April 7, 1990 is hereby declared "Community Development Week" celebrating the Community Development Block Grant Program in King County.
