MOTION NO. 7886

A MOTION to establish the citizen oversight committee to assist in implementation of the open space bond acquisition program, set forth in Ordinance 9071.

WHEREAS, the King County voters overwhelmingly approved the open space and trail projects set forth in Ordinance 9071, and

WHEREAS, the establishment and involvement of a citizen oversight committee is critical to the success of these open space and trails projects, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 9071 provides for the establishment and sets forth responsibilities of a citizen oversight committee, and

WHEREAS, the committee shall consider and address the concerns, needs and progress of all jurisdictions responsible for implementing Ordinance 9071;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. A countywide committee shall be established with the following citizens and representatives from the City of Seattle, suburban cities and unincorporated King County:

6 B. The purpose of this citizen oversight committee is to
7 provide advice and counsel to King County government and
8 oversight during implementation of the open space bond. Its
9 responsibilities shall include the following:

10 1. Presentation of a semi-annual report to the King
11 County council describing the status of the implementation of
12 the open space bond projects. The committee will receive semi-
13 annual reports from the participating local governments
14 describing their implementation of bond projects.

15 2. In the event a government wishes to use unanticipated
16 bond proceeds, as defined in Ordinance No. 9071, for projects
17 already authorized by the ordinance, the citizen oversight
18 committee shall review the proposed use of funds and comment as
19 appropriate to the executive and council.

20 3. In the event a government wishes to use unanticipated
21 bond proceeds, as defined in Ordinance No. 9071, for projects
22 not authorized by the open space bond ordinance, the committee
23 shall submit to the executive and the council a recommendation
24 regarding the merits of such use.

25 4. In the event a governmental agency applies for use of
26 conservation futures funding, the citizens oversight committee
27 shall, within 30 days of receipt, consider and make
28 recommendations on the request to the King County executive.
29 The executive shall transmit to the King County council the
30 committee's recommendation in conjunction with his
31 recommendation on the request, and the appropriate legislation.

5. Such other requests as shall be transmitted to the committee from time to time by the executive or council.

C. The executive is requested to direct the office of open space to provide staff assistance to the citizen oversight committee.
