A MOTION authorizing the executive to enter into an agreement with the 1990 Goodwill Games Seattle Organizing Committee and the Weyerhaeuser Company to name the King County Aquatic Center, "The Weyerhaeuser/King County Aquatic Center".

WHEREAS, the King County Aquatic Center was constructed with \$8.8 million of King County taxpayer's funds as well as considerable donations from the Weyerhaeuser Company and other private donors, and

WHEREAS, King County and the 1990 Goodwill Games Seattle
Organizing Committee (SOC) are party to a Use Agreement for the
King County Aquatic Center, and

WHEREAS, the Use Agreement allows the SOC to name, subject to approval of the county, the competitive aquatics components of the King County Aquatic Center with the name of a private donor who has made a significant contribution toward design and construction of the King County Aquatic Center, and

WHEREAS, the SOC also seeks to obtain additional rights and conditions not included in the Use Agreement with the County, and

WHEREAS, on July 19, 1990 five members of the county council and the county executive signed correspondence approving of the decision to name the facility the Weyerhaeuser/King County Aquatics Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County Aquatic Center shall be named "The Weyerhaeuser/King County Aquatic Center" and that name shall permanently appear on the facade of the facility.

 B. The county executive is authorized to enter into an agreement, substantially in the form attached, with the Seattle Organizing Committee of the Goodwill Games (SOC) and the Weyerhaeuser Company limited to granting the naming right as described in the Use Agreement between King County and the SOC and as modified by the July 19 correspondence.
