MOTION NO. 8063

A MOTION authorizing the County executive to make a grant application requesting funds approximating \$22,140 for use in improving the public health department's surveillance reporting system with respect to diseases that are potentially waterborne.

WHEREAS, Seattle and large sectors of King County receive drinking water from surface sources treated by chlorination without filtration, which past EPA-sponsored surveillance projects have correlated to waterborne outbreaks of disease, and

WHEREAS, an increase in the sensitivity of surveillance will more precisely define the role of waterborne transmission, and improve the completeness of case ascertainment, and

WHEREAS, the cumulative aspect of analysis will increase the likelihood of detecting small differences in risk of exposure to waterborne illnesses from unfiltered water or other types of water supplies and moreover the analysis will more readily identify outbreaks of reportable waterborne diseases, if present, and other enteric illness, including those thought to be foodborne in origin or whose origin is unclear, by geographic area (zip code) and type of water supply, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Russell Alexander, Chief of Epidemiology, James Hogan,
Epidemiologist, assisted by a programmer and a communicable disease
investigator, of which neither of the latter have yet to be appointed, will work
in conjunction with Group Health Cooperative.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the approximate amount of \$22,140 to the Washington State Department of Health for surveillance of waterborne diseases on behalf of King County.
- B. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor.

2	such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project.
3	D. The Washington State Department of Health is hereby assured full
4	compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
