A MOTION authorizing the County to make a grant application not to exceed \$200,000 to test and market yard waste products generated in King County.

WHEREAS, the testing of yard waste compost products is necessary to verify that these products meet minimum quality standards to increase their marketability, and

WHEREAS, the Compost Sub-Committee of the Washington Committee for Recycling Markets, recently established by the Washington State Department of Trade and Economic Development, has identified testing procedures and standards for yard waste products, and

WHEREAS, the success of recovering source separated yard waste and processing the material into new products is dependent on marketing products to end users, and

WHEREAS, Section 97 of Engrossed Substitute House Bill 1671, the Waste Not Washington Act, provides for the award of grants to establish the feasibility of composting food and yard waste, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Ecology has made grant funds available to obtain information about how to develop and expand markets for yard waste compost, and to obtain technical information about the quality of compost, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Ecology requires a twenty percent local match for awarded funds, and

WHEREAS, King County's match will not exceed \$50,000 and the council of King County recognizes an obligation to provide this amount in support of the program;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- The county executive is hereby authorized to make applications to the Department of Ecology for funds not to exceed \$200,000 for a yard waste product testing and marketing program on behalf of the King County Commission for Marketing Recyclable Materials;
- B. The county executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such 32 | application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by
