A MOTION authorizing the King County executive to purchase the 400 Yesler Building located at 400 Yesler Way in the City of Seattle.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the need for additional office space in downtown Seattle, close to the Courthouse Complex, is necessary for the efficient operation of King County government, and

WHEREAS, the 400 Yesler Way Associates, owner of the 400 Yesler Building, has given King County an option to purchase said building for the sum of six million and five hundred thousand dollars (\$6,500,000), payable upon closing, anticipated to be in the first quarter of 1991, and

WHEREAS, the 400 Yesler Building is within a one-block radius from the Courthouse Complex, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the purchase of said building is consistent with the County's long-range space plan, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it would be in the best interest of King County to purchase the 400 Yesler Building;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County council having deemed it necessary and in the best interest of King County does hereby authorize the King County executive to exercise that certain option dated November 28, 1990, wherein the 400 Yesler Way Associates have agreed to convey the

following described building for the sum of six million and five hundred thousand dollars (\$6,500,000), and does further authorize the King County executive to execute the necessary instruments to finalize the purchase of subject building in accordance with the term of said option:
