2 A MOTION proclaiming the week of January 14
3 through January 18, 1991 to be the Reverend
4 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Week in King
5 County, honoring Dr. King for his
6 leadership and conviction in promoting the
7 principle of equality for all humanity.

8 WHEREAS, "We are the Children, We are the Future," is
9 the theme for the Fourth Annual 1991 Reverend Dr. Martin Luther
10 King, Jr. Celebration, focusing on the importance of equality
11 and diversity for our children and their future, and

12 WHEREAS, children's introspection, music, dance and art
13 will highlight the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
14 Celebration, emphasizing the diversity of King County's work
15 force and the need to develop greater cultural awareness and
16 sensitivity, and

17 WHEREAS, Dr. King, born on January 15, 1929, worked to
18 protect the human rights and human dignity of all individuals,
19 and prompted the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and
20 the Voting Rights Act of 1965, both of which have benefitted
21 all citizens of this nation, and

22 WHEREAS, on February 24, 1986, the King County Council set
23 forth the historical basis for redesignating King County in
24 honor of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.;

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED: the King County Council
26 proclaims the week of January 14 through January 18, 1991 to be
27 the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Week in King County,
28 and

1 BE IT FURTHER MOVED: the Council recognizes and honors the
2 Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and his convictions to
3 promote the principle that all humanity is created equal.
