WHEREAS, Dr. King, born on January 15, 1929, worked to protect the human rights and human dignity of all individuals, and prompted the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965, both of which have benefitted all citizens of this nation, and

WHEREAS, on February 24, 1986, the King County Council set forth the historical basis for redesignating King County in honor of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.;
