A MOTION establishing and defining the composition and functions of the committees of the King County Council for 1991 and rescinding Motion 7795.

WHEREAS, the interests of the citizens of King County and the efficiency of the operations of the county council are best served by apportioning the duties and responsibilities of the Council among several committees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. Motion 7795 is hereby rescinded.
- B. The council may go into committee-of-the-whole at any time. The committee-of-the-whole shall consider issues of interest to the entire council, including projects in the 1991 work program; appointments to the state legislature, the executive branch and numerous boards and commissions; adopting an annual legislative program; review and monitor the countywide budget including revenues and the quarterly report and CIP, and receive and examine reports of the state and county auditors; and program policy matters; monitor BALD organizational review; analysis of proposed Seattle Center levy; 1% for the arts program, motel/hotel tax programs, intergovernmental meetings, and review agendas for council meetings.
- C. The chair of the council shall appoint the chair, vicechair and the membership of the standing committees, and any special ad hoc committees with consent of a majority of the councilmembers.
- D. In the absence of the chair and vice-chair of a committee, a committee member, designated by the committee chair may serve as chair of the meeting.

The standing committees are established as follows:

## 1. Comprehensive Plan Update

To consider and make recommendations relating to the review and update of the adopted 1985 King County Comprehensive

Plan. The committee will adopt revisions to guide overall county development, and private and public projects over a long time period to meet changing circumstances, unanticipated changes, policy conflicts or new issues not addressed in the original plan, review the proposed 1991 amendments to the State Growth Management Act and monitor implementation, Title 20 Code revisions and Zoning Code Update.

## 2. Growth Management, Communities and Environment

To consider and make recommendations on matters relating to planning and community development, and building and land development.

Special projects for 1991 include planning division work program monitoring, community plans, Soos Creek update, Northshore Plan Update, and Tahoma/Raven Heights update; Burien Activity Center development guide, monitoring the implementation of the Snoqualmie interlocal agreement.

## 3. Health, Housing and Human Services

To consider and make recommendations on matters relating to personal and environmental health, mental health, developmental disabilities, alcoholism and substance abuse, and emergency medical services; human services including cultural resources, aging programs and youth services; and affordable and public housing.

Special projects include focus on Children and Family Services Fund policies, community clinic and AIDS policies and funding, child care program evaluation, Harborview Hospital, health and youth services capital plans, Human Services Roundtable support, family violence and sexual assault program policies and adult and children's mental health services.

## 4. Law and Justice

To consider and make recommendations on matters relating to public safety, adult detention, constitutional and human rights; discrimination, civil and criminal liability, child abuse prevention, ethics, campaign practices, and the superior and district courts; judicial administration, prosecuting attorney and public defense.

Special projects for 1991 include interim and long-term jail plans, regional justice centers, police operations facilities and emergency plans review, communications upgrade planning, helicopter pilot project evaluation, superior court master plan, district court fines and penalty collection policy; operating long-range criminal justice plans and capital budgets.

## 5. Open Space, Parks and Natural Resources

To review and make recommendations on policies relating to natural resources, parks, water quality, basin planning, sewer and water districts, and the 1989 Open Space bond issue.

Special projects for 1991 include monitoring the Open Space bond program implementation, parks maintenance, Cougar Mountain acquisitions, railroad abandonment acquisitions, and transfer of parks to cities; the Kingdome master plan, parks CIP project management evaluation, and the parks/recreation program review.

## 6. Operation and Administration Services

To review and make recommendations on matters relating to the department of Executive Administration and Assessor; cable communications, cooperative extension community services, and risk management.

Special projects for 1991 include all non-legislative branch personnel matters, reorganization, comparable worth, Affirmative Action Plan, salary plans, and the Department of Executive Administration reorganization; courthouse restoration, cable television policy, systems services policies and organization plan, space plans, computer project reviews, and risk management policies.

## 7. Regional Affairs and Governance

To review and make recommendations on policies relating to interjurisdictional issues including the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle, the Puget Sound Council of Governments, the state legislature, suburban cities, special districts, and the

Boundary Review Board; economic development, solid waste disposal 1 and recycling; annexations and incorporations, and contracting 2 for municipal services, interlocal agreements, and regional 3 governance. Special projects in 1991 include METRO issues, PSCOG/MPO 5 regional development strategy, reorganization, interlocal 6 contracts, out of county disposal reviews, annexation policy, 7 Puget Sound Air Pollution Control Agency, Port of Seattle and 8 Puget Sound Water Quality Authority, and the "summit" process. 9 8.
