A MOTION requesting the executive to submit to the council a public safety anti-gang enforcement plan by May 1, 1991.

WHEREAS, law enforcement staff from jurisdictions throughout the county have indicated hard core gang activity is moving from Seattle to south county and other suburban communities, and

WHEREAS, the emergence of these gangs has already had a significant detrimental effect on the safety of youth, families and senior citizens in these communities, and

WHEREAS, if immediate action is not taken by the county to stem the growth of these gangs they will become increasingly violent and destructive;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The executive is hereby requested to submit to the council, by May 1, 1991, an inter-governmental anti-gang enforcement plan to be implemented by the department of public safety. This plan should identify the resources necessary to accomplish the following objectives:

- Α. perform all necessary anti-gang enforcement activities in the communities under county jurisdiction;
- combat the emergence of Asian/Pacific Islander, African American, Caucasian, Hispanic, and other gangs in these communities;
- in cooperation with school districts develop a school enforcement plan and establish anti-gang education programs.
- develop a regional response to anti-gang enforcement coordinated with Seattle and the Suburban cities.
