2 A motion authorizing the King County Executive to make
3 a grant application for funds in the approximate
4 amount of \$97,250 to duplicate and distribute public
5 education materials for a coordinated local/state-wide
6 waste reduction campaign and to duplicate and
7 distribute public education materials developed or
8 sponsored by the County.

9 WHEREAS, King County has adopted a goal of reducing and recycling the
10 waste stream by sixty-five percent by the year 2000, and

11 WHEREAS, waste reduction is the highest priority in the management of
12 solid waste, and

13 WHEREAS, King County's goals will require a considerable investment in
14 money and effort to educate waste generators to change behavior and generate
15 less waste, to generate waste which is more readily recyclable, and to recycle
16 a greater portion of their waste, and

17 WHEREAS, King County is responsible for providing regional promotion,
18 education and public involvement programs for waste reduction and recycling,
19 and

20 WHEREAS, Section 97 of Engrossed Substitute House Bill 1671, the Waste
21 Not Washington Act, provides for the award of grants to local governments for
22 local education efforts, and

23 WHEREAS, the Department of Ecology has established the Waste Reduction
24 and Recycling Public Information and Education Grants with a matching
25 requirement of twenty-five percent from local governments for coordinated
26 local/state-wide programs and a matching requirement of fifty percent for
27 materials developed locally, and

28 WHEREAS, the council of King County recognizes an obligation to provide
29 the amount of about \$46,987.50 as a required cash match in support of this
30 program;

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

32 A. The county executive is hereby authorized to make application to the
Department of Ecology on behalf of King County for funds in the approximate
amount of \$97,250 for a waste reduction public education campaign.

1 B. The county executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such
2 application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required
3 by the grantor;

4 C. The county executive is also authorized to enter into and execute
5 such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project; and

6 D. The Department of Ecology is hereby assured of full compliance with
7 Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
