Bellevue

East of Bothell - Missing Link Trail Phase II Dev.

- Green River Trail Phase I Dev. South of Seattle

East of Bothell - Kenmore Boat Launch Dev.

The county's share of these projects will be derived from bond proceeds, General Fund or Real Estate Excise Tax.
