A MOTION requesting the King County Executive to report to the King County Council on the flooding problem at Horseshoe Lake and to declare that an emergency exists in order to expedite the provision of temporary relief.

WHEREAS, flooding of homes has occurred around Horseshoe Lake, and

WHEREAS, Horseshoe Lake has been the subject of numerous studies and analyses regarding this problem, and

WHEREAS, the cause of the rising lake level has not been determined, and

WHEREAS, flooding conditions are continuing and increasing and have risen above the 100 year flood level, and

WHEREAS, numerous proposals have been offered for solutions but the problem has not been rectified;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County Executive is requested to conduct a review of the Horseshoe Lake flooding problem, determine the probable cause of the problem, and determine what responsibilities the County has with regard to this situation and develop potential solutions. The King County Executive is requested to provide a preliminary report to the Council by May 31, 1991 and a final report to the Council by June 28, 1991.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED, the County Executive is encouraged to declare immediately that an emergency exists so that King
