#### 1991 AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF FEDERAL WAY AND KING COUNTY RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

This is a 1991 amendment to the Interlocal Agreement between the City of Federal Way, a municipal corporation of the State of Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and King County, a home-rule charter county, a political subdivision of the State of Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "County".

WHEREAS, the City and the County have entered into an Interlocal Agreement relating to law enforcement services effective February 28, 1990; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County have negotiated certain amendments to the Agreement for the calendar year 1991; and

WHEREAS, the parties have the authority to proceed with these amendments to the Interlocal Agreement pursuant to the terms of the Agreement and Chapter 39.34 RCW;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual covenants, the City and County hereby agree to amend the Interlocal Agreement between the City and the County Relating to Law Enforcement services as follows:

1. Section 2, Supplemental Services, is amended to read:

Supplemental Services shall consist of five full-time equivalent patrol officers, in addition to necessary supervision, assigned exclusively to the City for the primary purpose of providing traffic services desired by the City, except that these services shall terminate effective March 1, 1991.

If the City desires to reinstate supplemental services in the future, the City Manager and the County Sheriff are authorized to determine the type and level of and compensation for supplemental services consistent with Section 7. Such determination shall be documented in a Memorandum of Understanding.

- 2. Section 6, Compensation--Base Level Services, is amended to read:
- a. Contract Amount. In consideration for the base level services provided by the County as set forth herein, the City promises to pay to the County a sum equal to the City's share of net annual chargeable costs, determined according to the following methodology:

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--the amount of the Department of Public Safety's annual adopted budget, including any negotiated cost-of-living increases and any other funds specifically identified for police services in the County's budget;

--less any services designated as regional, along with associated departmental and countywide overhead;

- --plus departmental and countywide overhead associated with the direct services;
- --plus capital projects with countywide benefit (amortized over the life of the project).

For 1991, the net annual chargeable costs shall be allocated to the City based on the City's average percentage of the Department of Public Safety's total dispatched calls for service during 1990. The contract amount for 1991 is \$6,532,800 as shown in the revised Exhibit I and accompanying tables. The Exhibit and tables shall be revised for each subsequent budget year.

- b. Billing. The contract amount will be billed in equal monthly amounts. Payments are due within 30 days after invoicing by the County.
- c. Other. For the City's planning purposes, the County will transmit to the City by September 15 of each year an estimate of the next calendar year's contract amount.
- 3. Section 7, Compensation--Supplemental Services, is amended to read:
- a. Contract Amount. In consideration of the supplemental services provided by the County as set forth herein, the City promises to pay to the County the actual additional costs of providing the service, including but not limited to personnel, capital equipment and departmental supervision as shown in Exhibit II. The contract amount for 1991 is \$41,666.
- b. Billing. The contract amount will be billed in equal monthly amounts. Payments are due within 30 days after invoicing by the County.
- c. Other. For the City's planning purposes, the County will transmit to the City by September of each year an estimate of the next calendar year's contract amount.
- d. Disposition of Vehicles. The County shall apply a credit to the 1991 contract amount referenced in Section 6(a) in the amount of \$88,815, which is equal to the value of the remaining life of the five and one-half traffic patrol vehicles purchased for supplemental services, in addition to any replacement funds contributed by the City.

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- 4. Resource Allocation. The parties agree that should the Department of Public Safety, as a whole, be required to reduce its forces or conduct a department-wide budget cutback, the City's services shall be so reduced or cut back on a pro-rata equal share. The parties further agree that vacancies and vacation leave, sick leave and other leaves shall be shared proportionately between the City and the County.
- 5. All other terms and conditions not inconsistent with these amendments in the Interlocal Agreement shall remain in full force and effect pursuant to the terms as stated therein.
- 6. All acts in conformance with this amendment occurring from January 1, 1991 to the date of signing are hereby ratified.
