MOTION NO.

A MOTION relating to the implementation of the comprehensive plan policies regarding density goals in the community plans and to provide for minimum densities in urban areas.

WHEREAS, King County is experiencing and will continue to experience growth, both in its cities and unincorporated areas, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature approved SHB 2929 (1990 Wash. Laws 17) which specifies that urban growth be located in areas designated as urban, and

WHEREAS, the King County Comprehensive Plan states that the county should seek to achieve an average density of 7 to 8 dwelling units per acre in the Urban Area, and

WHEREAS, the growth capacity in the urban and transitional areas of unincorporated King County in 1985 was 355,000 housing units, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council has approved and will be asked to approve Executive proposals for density restrictions in environmentally sensitive areas of the County, and

WHEREAS, residential densities have been much lower in unincorporated King County than inside cities, and

WHEREAS, the County does not require projects to meet zoning densities to ensure the most efficient use of the county's buildable land, and

WHEREAS, the under utilization of zoned land can adversely affect the ability of home buyers to afford housing, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council has an obligation to ensure compliance with the Growth Management Act as well as the county's comprehensive plan, and

WHEREAS, nothing in this motion is intended to undermine 1 the King County Sensitive Area Ordinance, State Environmental 2 Policy Act, or environmental policies contained within the King 3 County Comprehensive Plan; 4 5 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: The King County Executive is requested to ensure that 6 7 the county's density goals for urban areas are met in the community plans by increasing the permitted densities in areas 8 9 suitable for urban growth to balance the densities lost through density restrictions applied to protect environmentally 10 sensitive lands, particularly streams and wetlands. 11 12 The King County Executive is also requested to develop a policy as part of the Comprehensive Plan update process to 13 require that projects meet minimum density standards with due 14 regard for environmental protection. 15 16 The King County Executive is also requested to develop 17 a policy as part of the Comprehensive Plan update which will ensure that densities in the urban designated areas of 18 community planning areas are sufficient to support transit 19 20 service. The King County Executive is requested to ensure that 21 where densities are increased in community plans, that all 22 Comprehensive Plan policies are complied with, including but 23 F105, R201, R204, and R207. not limited to: 24 day of 25 KING COUNTY COUNCIL 26 KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON 27 28 29
