2 A MOTION authorizing the King County Executive
3 or his designee to sign and submit a grant
4 application in the approximate amount of \$600,000
5 to the Federal Department of Health and Human
6 Services for the purpose of funding a community
7 home-based family services program which would
8 be an alternative to out-of-home shelter for youth.

9 WHEREAS, in King County there are 5,000 youth each
10 year who are reported as having run away from home and as
11 many as another 5,000 who are "kicked out" of their own home,
12 and,

13 WHEREAS, it is estimated that approximately 3,000 youth
14 will need to be placed in out-of-home shelter during 1991, and

15 WHEREAS, home-based family intervention services are
16 effective in keeping the youth at home as an alternative to
17 out-of-home placement and keeping the family intact, and

18 WHEREAS, the grant would allow King County to leverage
19 additional funds to intervene in dysfunctional families, to
20 prevent youth from placements outside of the home, and to create
21 a model for coordinated community based intervention;

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

23 The King County executive is authorized to apply for grant
24 funding in the approximate amount of \$600,000 from the Federal
25 Department of Health and Human Services for the purpose of
26 implementing a community home-based family intervention project
27 serving youth and families as an alternative to out-of-home
28 placements. This grant will provide funding to the Youth &
29 Family Services Network and the Youth Shelter System
