2 A MOTION authorizing the county executive  
3 to make a grant preapplication for funds  
4 in the approximate amount of \$765,900 to  
5 support construction of the NE Apron and  
6 the installation of lighted guidance  
7 signs at the King County International  
8 Airport/Boeing Field.

9 WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal  
10 Aviation Administration, is empowered to make grants to support  
11 improvements at public airports, and

12 WHEREAS, construction of the NE Apron will provide space  
13 for 74 additional single engine aircraft at the King County  
14 International Airport/Boeing Field and would improve the  
15 capacity of the airport, and

16 WHEREAS, installation of lighted taxiway guidance signs on  
17 various taxiways will enable the airport to comply with FAA  
18 standards for airport signage systems, and

19 WHEREAS, the additions of the NE Apron and the lighted  
20 guidance signs will assist the county in meeting the needs of  
21 users of the King County International Airport/Boeing Field;

22 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

23 A. The King County executive is hereby authorized to make  
24 a preapplication for funds in the approximate amount of  
25 \$765,900 to the Department of Transportation, Federal Aviation  
26 Administration, to support construction of the NE Apron and the  
27 installation of lighted guidance signs at the King County  
28 International Airport/Boeing Field, on behalf of King County;


29 B. The King County executive is hereby authorized to file


C. The Department of Transportation is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.
