MOTION NO. ~~8538~~

A MOTION authorizing applications for funding assistance for an outdoor recreation or habitat conservation project to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

WHEREAS, King County has approved an "Open Space Plan" identifying trails, natural areas and greenbelts which are needed to develop a quality park and open space system, and

WHEREAS, the county is in the process of completing a comprehensive park and recreation plan, and

WHEREAS, under the provision of the Marine Recreation Land Act or the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, state and federal funding assistance may be authorized for financing the acquisition of parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction of public outdoor recreational facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County executive is authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance through the 1993 grant cycle for the following projects:

10           B. When further information is available regarding the  
11 1993 funding cycle for Interagency Committee grants, the  
12 executive is required to obtain approval from the Parks, Open  
13 Space and Natural Resources Committee before submitting grant  
14 applications for specific projects.

15           C. King County does hereby certify that, if a specific  
16 project grant is accepted, the county will fully support its  
17 grant match commitments.

18           D. Any property acquired with financial aid through the  
19 Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation shall be used as  
20 an outdoor recreation area or habitat conservation area and be  
21 retained in such use in perpetuity unless otherwise provided  
22 and agreed to by the King County council, the Interagency  
23 Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal  
24 agency.


25           E. This motion shall be part of the formal application to  
26 the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

27           F. The office of open space has given adequate  
28 notification and opportunity for public input and published  
29 notices identifying affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if  
30 applicable.

1 G. King County does certify that the county is owner of  
2 lands to be developed based on current knowledge and provides  
3 assurance there are no encumbrances on such lands which would  
4 restrict the recreation or habitat conservation use of the land  
5 as proposed in this application.


