A MOTION stating King County's policy regarding multicounty land use planning requirements under the Growth Management Act.

WHEREAS, King County has vigorously supported the requirements of SHB 2929 and ReESHB 1025 regarding local, countywide and multicounty comprehensive planning and policy development, and

WHEREAS, King County elected officials are active participants in the King County Growth Management Planning Council, the organization established by interlocal agreements between the county and its constituent cities to satisfy ReESHB 1025 county-wide policy plan requirements, and

WHEREAS, King County elected officials are also active participants on the Executive Board and committees of the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC), which was established on October 1, 1991, through an interlocal agreement among King, Kitsap, Pierce and Snohomish Counties and the majority of their constituent cities, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to clarify how all of these independent efforts interrelate, and

WHEREAS, Article VII.A. of the PSRC interlocal agreement provided that the agency would carry out Metropolitan Planning Organization functions as prescribed under federal law and Regional Transportation Planning Organization functions under state law, and

WHEREAS, Article VII.B. of the interlocal agreement provided further:

Growth Management. The agency shall maintain VISION 2020 as the adopted regional growth management strategy. The regional growth

and

management strategy shall be based on and developed from local comprehensive planning...,

WHEREAS, Article VII.C. of the interlocal agreement provided further:

Countywide Comprehensive Plans. One year after adoption of this Agreement, a process for the regional review of countywide plans (which reflect city and county comprehensive plans) for consistency with the adopted regional growth strategy and/or the regional transportation plan shall be considered by the governing Board of the new Regional Council,

and

WHEREAS, the Regional Organizing Committee that developed the interlocal agreement adopted clarifying language as to the PSRC's role in growth management, and

WHEREAS, the following clarifying language accompanied the proposed interlocal agreement when it was circulated to all jurisdictions for approval:

The Organizing Committee developed the original Interlocal Agreement with the intent that the new regional planning agency would restrict its role in growth management, for the present time, to maintaining Vision 2020. One year after the adoption of the Interlocal Agreement a process will be considered for regional review of countywide plans for consistency with the adopted regional growth strategy. However, no new efforts in growth management can be implemented without action of the Executive Board and General Assembly,

and

WHEREAS, Section 2.(7) of ReESHB 1025 provided:

Multicounty planning policies shall be adopted by two or more counties, each with a population of four hundred fifty thousand or more, with contiguous urban areas and may be adopted by other counties, according to the process established under this section or other processes agreed to among the counties and cities within the affected counties throughout the multicounty region,

and

WHEREAS, the PSRC interlocal agreement does not establish a process for preparation of multi-county planning policies and their adoption by counties, and

WHEREAS, the PSRC could serve as an appropriate forum to discuss the process, and

WHEREAS, the counties and cities could decide to utilize the PSRC as the vehicle for implementing such a process but to date have not done so;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. While the language of Section 2.(7) of ReESHB 1025 states no clear deadline for initiating the multicounty planning policy process, the member counties and cities of the PSRC have agreed to consider a process for regional review of countywide plans for consistency with the regional growth strategy after October 1, 1992.
- B. The planning process envisioned by both the Growth Management Act as amended and the PSRC interlocal agreement is an interactive one that relies heavily upon the development of local and countywide plans and policies. Countywide planning policies, which are the basic building blocks for the multicounty policies, are being developed now by the cities and counties in order to meet the statutory deadline of July 1, 1992.
- C. The agreement to consider PSRC's role in multicounty planning one year after the adoption of the interlocal is

consistent with both the ReESHB 1025 requirement that affected 1 cities and counties agree to a multicounty process and the 2 3 practical realities of an interactive planning process. King County and other jurisdictions that approved the 4 PSRC interlocal agreement did so with the understanding that 5 the agency's priority mission for the present is developing 6 policies, procedures, work programs and staffing arrangements 7 that will enable it to function as the Regional Transportation 8 Planning Organization/Metropolitan Planning Organization for 9 transportation in this four-county region. 10 16 th day of PASSED this \_\_\_ 11 12 KING COUNTY COUNCIL KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON 13 14 15 ATTEST: 16 17 18
