MOTION NO.

A MOTION establishing King County's priorities for a responsive and effective Puget Sound Regional Council 1993 Work Program and Budget.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Regional Council was reestablished on October 1, 1991 as a successor to the Puget Sound Council of Governments to improve intergovernmental collaboration and consensus-building between local governments in the four-county area, and

WHEREAS, the four-county Organizing Committee agreed to limit the role of the new multicounty agency in growth management until October 1, 1992, one year after reconstitution and also agreed that a process for review of countywide policies and plans in the new agency's work program would be implemented only after action of the Executive Board, and

WHEREAS, the Ad Hoc Committee on Growth Management has been discussing the merits of adopting the Vision 2020 Growth and Transportation Strategy as the initial multicounty statement for King, Pierce, Snohomish and Kitsap County, prior to the July 1, 1992 adoption of the countywide policies in each of the respective counties, and

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Regional Council's Executive Board will be adopting its first annual Work Program and Budget under its revised Bylaws, and will be recommending it to the Assembly for adoption on March 25, 1992, and

WHEREAS, the priorities of the Work Program must be responsive to the current county and city Growth Management processes, policy frameworks and comprehensive plans currently under study which will be adopted by July 1, 1992 and July 1, 1993, to meet the provisions of the state Growth Management Act, and

WHEREAS, the current fiscal environment of reduced public revenues and economic austerity require a periodic reassessment and redefinition of the regional council's work program to reduce duplication and improve the coordination of efforts of local and multi-county jurisdictions;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. King County has established in a separate Motion its policies relating to multi-county Growth Management activities as authorized under the State Growth Management Act and amendments to it, and
- B. King County will support the following priorities to be adopted as part of the 1993 Puget Sound Regional Council Work Program and Budget.
- Increased emphasis and funding should be directed to the upgrading of the regional data base element of the work program.
- 2. The establishment of an on-going Planning and Public Works Directors' Steering Committee with membership from local and state governments to open up communication and provide technical advice on technical issues and work program items.
- 3. Development of mutually supportive multi-county budgets with local budgets and work programs. This would include the development of an effective performance monitoring of the evaluation process of the Regional Council's staff work and work products.
- 4. Adoption of a new system for transportation planning and funding allocations as required by the new 1991 Federal Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA), to carry out the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) functions and the state statutory requirements for the Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RTPO).
- 5. Support the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for Air Quality.
- 6. Review and evaluate the proposed Regional Transit Project for consistency with the Regional Transportation Plan.

- Work for the continued integration and evaluation of the Flight Plan Project and the State Air Commission studies and recommendations, for consistency of recommended capital facilities with the adopted countywide growth management policies and local comprehensive plans.
- Assist in the coordination and cooperative planning with the local jurisdictions on the ongoing Growth Management processes underway in each of the four counties, and in defining the regional and countywide goals, policies and processes to reduce duplication of efforts and refinement into a multi-county policy statement, consistent with adopted countywide growth management plans. This may include amending the work program after the October 1, 1992 growth management process has been adopted by the Executive Board.
- The King County council supports the recommendation that a subcommittee of the Puget Sound Regional Council's Operations Committee be established to review and recommend the organizational dues-setting methodology, and report back to the local governments in adequate time to be included in the local governments' budget review processes.
- The King County council also requests that the Regional Council establish a process to involve the member governments and their staffs in the annual setting of priorities for the proposed Work Program and Budget allocations, prior to the development of the annual local government's budget process.
