A MOTION conveying the King County Council's recommendation that the airport planning comply with the provisions of the Growth Management Act of 1991 and include consideration of the recommendations of the Washington State Air Transportation Commission.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Air Transportation Committee (PSATC) has been asked to recommend a preferred alternative for increasing the Puget Sound region's air capacity to meet projected demand through the year 2020, and

WHEREAS, the PSATC has preliminarily recommended a "Multiple Airport System" that utilizes Seattle/Tacoma
International Airport and Paine Field in Snohomish County to provide for the region's projected air capacity needs, and

WHEREAS, the primary element of that recommendation is the expansion of Seattle/Tacoma International Airport to provide a dependant third runway, and

WHEREAS, the King County council by Motion No. 7138 has previously expressed reservations and concerns about expansion at Seattle/Tacoma International Airport, and

WHEREAS, other alternatives have been identified that provide sufficient air capacity to meet projected needs without expansion of Seattle/Tacoma International Airport, and

WHEREAS, operations of airports, including Seattle/Tacoma International Airport, produce environmental impacts on neighborhoods situated near the facilities and also create noise impacts for other communities subject to aircraft overflights, and

WHEREAS, siting and developing airports and airport facilities consistent with statewide planning in the central Puget Sound region require cooperative planning between cities and counties, and

WHEREAS, Section 1 of the Growth Management Act of 1991 (GMA) requires that King County's comprehensive plan include a "process for identifying and siting essential public facilities" including, specifically, "airports", and

WHEREAS, recognizing the importance and impacts of air transportation facilities the State of Washington by RCW 47.86 created the Washington State Air Transportation Commission (WSATC) to determine and recommend statewide air transportation policies through a comprehensive examination of issues, and

WHEREAS, the WSATC will present an final report by December 1, 1994;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. King County supports a process for planning and siting additional airport capacity and airport facilities that includes a cooperative effort with other local governments in the adoption of countywide planning policies as required pursuant to Section 2 of the GMA and which considers the recommendations of the WSATC as well as the PSATC.
- B. Pending the completion of the final report of the WSATC and the development of countywide planning policies for airports as required by the GMA, no additional airports or runways to increase airport capacity should be constructed.
