MOTION NO. 8704

A MOTION relating to regional governance; calling for a meeting of elected officials from King County jurisdictions to discuss governance issues for the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle (Metro) and King County.

WHEREAS, on June 18, 1992 the Honorable William Dwyer, Judge, U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington issued a final order in the case of Cunningham et al v. METRO (No. C89-1587D) providing that on April 30, 1993 only the members of the King County Council and the King County Executive shall have the authority to vote as members of the Metro Council, and

WHEREAS, a majority of the voters of King County voting at the general election of November 5, 1991 voted in favor of ballot propositions conferring the statutory powers of Metro on King County and amending the King County charter to provide for 13 councilmembers and intergovernmental committees to review county-wide policy plans, and

WHEREAS, such ballot propositions were defeated solely due to a statutory dual-majority requirement for county-Metro merger, which statute is the subject of on-going litigation in federal court, and

WHEREAS, during 1990 and 1991 the Regional Governance Summit convened by King County provided a forum for detailed discussions by elected officials representing King County, the City of Seattle, and suburban cities of King County regarding the appropriate form of governance for county-wide issues including transit, water quality, transportation, growth management and other issues. The Regional Governance Summit

led to the ballot proposals approved by a majority of voters in 1991 and provided for the formal involvement of representatives of both incorporated and unincorporated areas, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of
King County for decisions regarding the structure of their
regional government to be made with a substantial consensus of
views of their elected representatives, and

WHEREAS, the most effective way to ensure such consensus is to reconvene the Regional Governance Summit in a timely manner to allow consideration of possible ballot propositions or legislative proposals as alternatives to implementation of Judge Dwyer's order;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. King County invites all elected officials who participated in the prior Regional Governance Summit or their successors to join with King County in reconvening the Regional Governance Summit. The initial meeting shall take place in the Metro Council Chambers at 12:00 noon on Wednesday, July 1, 1992 at the written invitation of the chair of the county council.
- B. King County declares as a matter of policy that it desires to reach agreement with affected jurisdictions in King County as to the best governmental structure to represent the people of the county on issues affecting public transit, transportation, and water quality. The recent success of the Growth Management Planning Council in developing a recommended

2	governments to work together effectively to plan for the
3	region's future.
