MOTION NO. _8708

A MOTION requesting the department of parks, planning and resources to monitor and assist the Snoqualmie Pass Planning Advisory Council in preparing a report and recommendation on land use at Snoqualmie Pass

WHEREAS, the Snoqualmie Pass has been a developed winter recreation area since the opening of its first ski lift in 1937, and

WHEREAS, a portion of the Pass area currently devoted to developed outdoor recreation is within King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County Comprehensive Plan recognizes that recreational developments such as ski areas and associated hotels are desirable when compatible with continued forestry on adjacent lands, and

WHEREAS, Policy RL-207 of the King County Comprehensive Plan states that for recreational development in a Forestry Production District, "A discretionary review process should be used to ensure that building siting, size, design and supporting public facilities limit the impacts to surrounding forest management activities", and

WHEREAS, the Snoqualmie Pass area is within that portion of eastern King County for which no community plan is prepared, and

WHEREAS, the Council adopted the King County Resource Lands Area Zoning in 1989 which applied the Forestry Classification to lands at Snoqualmie Pass while recognizing that "The Forest Production District also includes areas that are well-suited to the development of commercial recreation uses such as ski areas, resorts and conference centers."

WHEREAS, Kittitas County has given its approval to a Planned Unit Development containing a hotel, condominiums, a restaurant and retail space on land abutting King County, and

WHEREAS, Snoqualmie Pass property owners, residents and 1 2 other interested citizens formed the Snoqualmie Pass Planning Advisory Committee (SNOPPAC) in March of 1990 to create a plan 3 for development at the Pass, and 4 WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Community 5 Development approved a \$25,000 planning grant to SNOPPAC from 6 7 its Local Development Matching Fund grant in September of 1991, and 8 WHEREAS, Kittitas County has provided \$12,500 in matching 9 funds and worked with SNOPPAC to develop a plan, and 10 WHEREAS, parks, planning and resources department staff 11 has been attending SNOPPAC meetings and monitoring their plan 12 development process, and 13 WHEREAS, there will be no direct cost to King County other 14 than a continuation of this monitoring, and 15 WHEREAS, SNOPPAC intends to complete a plan by the end of 16 1992 that will include lands that are within King County. 17 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 1.8 A. The department of parks, planning and resources is 19 requested to continue to monitor the Snoqualmie Pass Planning 20 Advisory Council as it prepares a report and recommendations to 21 the King County council and to assist it by providing it with a 22 thorough understanding of relevant King County plans, policies 23 24 and regulations. B.
