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A MOTION approving projects for the  
Cultural Facilities Program.

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WHEREAS, the King County arts commission is authorized by  
Ordinance 10189 to administer projects in the King County  
education and cultural development fund, which includes the  
King County cultural facilities program, and

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WHEREAS, receipts for the education and cultural  
development fund are not collected until the last quarter of  
1992, and

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WHEREAS, the King County council approved interim  
guidelines for urgent need and emergency applications in Motion  
8599, and

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WHEREAS, the King County arts commission received two  
applications requesting \$80,975 in emergency or urgent need  
funds under the cultural facilities program, and

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WHEREAS, the King County arts commission has reviewed the  
applications, as shown in Attachment 1, and recommends funding  
these two projects in the total amount of \$57,095, and

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WHEREAS, the recommendations for project funding adhere to  
the proposed guidelines sent to the King County council,

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NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

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The following recommendations from the King County arts  
commission for cultural facilities program project funding,  
described below, is hereby approved:


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A. Up to \$36,000 to New City Theater foundation,  
electrical, roof and plumbing repairs to their theater  
facility, contingent on 1) negotiation of ownership and public  
benefit requirements, 2) receipt by King County arts commission  
of hotel-motel tax revenues in the last quarter of 1992, and 3)  
submittal of final costs and receipts.


1           B. Up to \$21,095 to Vashon Allied Arts for foundation and  
2 chimney repairs to their Blue Heron Center cultural facility,  
3 contingent on 1) negotiation of ownership and public benefit  
4 requirements, 2) receipt by King County arts commission of  
5 hotel-motel tax revenues in the last quarter of 1992, 3)  
6 submittal of final costs and receipts, and 4) completion of a  
7 financial review consistent with council approved interim  
8 guidelines for urgent need funding.
