A MOTION requesting the Prosecuting Attorney to file an action seeking a declaratory judgement that Washington Initiative 134, Section 24, does not preempt or supersede King County Charter Section 690.10.

WHEREAS, King County Charter section 690.10 requires that the county council establish by ordinance mandatory limits on campaign contributions and voluntary limits on campaign expenditures with public matching funds for county charter elected offices, and

WHEREAS, King County voters approved this amendment to the King County Charter at the general election in November 1989, and

WHEREAS, the Council has enacted Chapter 1.05 of the King County Code providing limits on campaign contributions, and

WHEREAS, as stated in the preamble to King County Code Chapter 1.05, it is in the public interest to encourage the widest participation of the public in the electoral process, to reduce the dependence of candidates on large contributions and to increase public knowledge of the candidates and of election issues, and

WHEREAS, the preamble further states that campaign expenditure limitations are in the best interest of the public, and

WHEREAS, the preamble further states that public matching funds for campaign purposes are necessary for voluntary expenditure limitations to be successful and voluntary programs are the only limitations constitutionally permissible, the council finds a program of public matching funds should be established.

WHEREAS, Washington Initiative 134, Section 24, approved by the voters at the November 3, 1992 general election, states that public funds shall not be used to finance political

campaigns for state or local office effective December 3, 1992, 1 2 and WHEREAS, as a home rule charter county under the 3 provisions of Article XI, Section 4 of the Washington state 4 constitution King County has the broadest possible powers of 5 local self-government, and the will of the voters of King 6 7 County mandating a voluntary campaign expenditure and public matching funds program as expressed in the county charter 8 9 should be respected; NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 10 The Council requests that the Prosecuting Attorney file an 11 action, on or before March 1, 1993, seeking a declaratory 12 judgment that King County Charter Section 690.10 is a valid 13 local law which is not preempted, superseded or otherwise 14 limited or affected by the provisions of Initiative 134. 15 PASSED this / 6 Th day of Lebruar 16 KING COUNTY COUNCIL 17 KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON 18 19 20 ATTEST: 21 22 Attachments: 24
