The King County executive is authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance though the 1994 grant cycle for the following projects:

- E. This motion shall be part of the formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
- F. The office of open space has given adequate notification and opportunity for public input and published notices identifying affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
- G. King County does certify that the county is owner of lands to be developed based on current knowledge and provides
