A MOTION authorizing the King County executive to make a grant application for funds in the approximate amount of \$1,700,000 for the period October 1, through September 30, 1996 to expand capacity and treatment services to incarcerated women and incorporate this enhanced treatment continuum into a network of community based service agencies.

WHEREAS, the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment is empowered to make grants in support of programs to address the treatment needs to incarcerated women, and

WHEREAS, existing treatment programs for the incarcerated population has primarily served male inmates to date, and

WHEREAS, women in this target population are predominately unemployed, mothers of children ranging in age from infants to teens, roughly 1/3 are first-time confinees, and

WHEREAS, the proposed comprehensive Women's Intensive Recovery Program represents a collaborative public-private partnership that will bring together direct treatment and collateral programs within a seamless continuum of care for confined females, and

WHEREAS, the council recognizes that the funds secured through an approval of the application by the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment will support the entire cost of the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- The King county executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the amount of \$1,700,000 to the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment to support the Women's Intensive Recovery Program;
- The King County Executive is hereby authorized to file and execute such application and to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the grantor;
