A MOTION relating to consolidation of Metro with King County; adopting, as recommendations to the new Metropolitan King County Council, a statement of the mission, goals and guiding principles for the newly consolidated government.

WHEREAS, Charter Amendment One (Ordinance 10530) and Proposition One (Ordinance 10531) approved by the voters at the November 3, 1992 general election provide for the organizational consolidation of Metro and the county under a new metropolitan legislative authority effective January 1, 1994, and

WHEREAS, there is a need to state a guiding vision for the newly consolidated government, and

WHEREAS, it is important that such a vision be clearly articulated and understood by all consolidation participants, including elected officials, employees of both organizations, labor unions and the public, and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 15, and 16, 1993 a group of about three hundred Metro employees and three hundred county employees, representing all levels of the two organizations met and jointly prepared a proposed statement of the mission, goals and guiding principles for the newly consolidated government, and

WHEREAS, that statement of mission, goals, and guiding principles is an appropriate, inspirational vision of what the newly consolidated government should strive to be and to achieve,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The attached statement of the mission, goals and guiding principles for the newly consolidated government is hereby adopted, as a recommendation to the new Metropolitan

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King County Council and as guidance for the Consolidation
Transition Committee and the Consolidation Advisory Committee.

- B. The following new practices, as steps toward putting the statement's words into action, are hereby adopted:
- 1. The Council will begin scheduling, starting in August, 1993, regular informal meetings, initially on a monthly basis, with interested Councilmembers and interested staff members from all levels and all organizational units of the Council to discuss problems, concerns, and ideas for improvements to the operation of the legislative branch of County government.
- 2. The Council will establish, starting in August, 1993, a staffed information table preceeding each regular Council meeting to assist members of the public who wish to testify at public hearings.
- 3. Interested Councilmembers will make themselves available to meet with groups of Metro and King County employees who are interested in learning the perspectives of elected County officials on the legislative decision making process in King County, particularly as it is shaped or influenced by separated executive and legislative powers and partisan elective offices.
