MOTION NO.

A MOTION requesting that the King County Executive prepare for approval by the Council a work program, schedule, and policies for analyzing and reconciling salary and benefit differences between King County and Metro salaries and benefits.

WHEREAS, Charter Amendment One (Ordinance 10530) and Proposition One (Ordinance 10531) approved by the voters at the November 3, 1992 general election provide for the organizational consolidation of Metro and the county under a new metropolitan legislative authority effective January 1, 1994, and

WHEREAS, Metro and King County may have had different approaches to determining appropriate compensation, including both salaries and benefits, for employees, and

WHEREAS, it is important for employee morale and for responsible fiscal management that the analysis and reconciliation of inappropriate differences in compensation be conducted and completed and a new total compensation plan adopted as quickly as possible;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County Executive is hereby requested to prepare and transmit for council review in draft form by November 15, 1993, and for council approval in final form by December 1, 1993:
- 1. a detailed work program and schedule for the preparation of an executive proposed comprehensive classification, pay and benefit plan for the newly consolidation government that includes reconciliation of inappropriate differences in compensation; and
- 2. proposed policies to guide the preparation of an executive proposed comprehensive classification and pay plan

for all employees of the executive branch of the newly consolidated government.

- B. The proposed work program and schedule should include:
- the priority order, schedule, and rationale for reviewing different kinds of jobs;
- 2. the proposed organizational structure for overseeing and performing the work, for resolving differences in opinion, and for involving human resource office representatives, finance office representatives, line user agency representatives and employees and labor union representatives;
 - 3. the proposed use, if any, of consultants; and
 - 4. the proposed budget for performing the work.
- C. The proposed policies to guide the preparation of an executive proposed classification and pay plan should include:
- the market(s) to be used and the rationale for their use; the alternative markets considered but eliminated and the rationale for their elimination;
- 2. the percentage of market average to be used and the rationale; and
- 3. sample results of applying alternative policies, including the selected alternative and the eliminated alternatives, to selected position classifications to demonstrate the effect on cost.
