MOTION NO. 9120

A MOTION regarding production of video voters' pamphlets for the Nov. 2, 1993 general election.

WHEREAS, King County and the City of Seattle regularly publish printed voters' pamphlets to inform citizens about election candidates and ballot issues, and

WHEREAS, video technology could be used to produce video voters' pamphlets which would enhance citizen knowledge of candidates and issues, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council is willing to provide funding for an initial effort to make use of video technology for the benefit of voters, and

WHEREAS, King County and Seattle together possess facilities which could be used to produce and distribute video voters' pamphlets in advance of the November 2, 1993 general elections, and

WHEREAS, the November 2, 1993 general election will include candidate races vital to the futures of King County, the Municipality of Metorpolitan Seattle (Metro), and Seattle;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The City of Seattle is invited to join King County in producing and distributing video voters' pamphlets for the November 2, 1993 general election.
- 2. The County Council suggests this project be pursued as a joint effort by the Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission, the King County Division of Records and Elections, Seattle Municipal Channel 28, the video production unit of the King County Stadium Administration Department, and the King County Office of Cable Communications, as follows:
- a. Candidate participation in the video pamphlets shall be voluntary and available to all general election candidates in races for King County Executive, the Metropolitan-King

County Council, Seattle Mayor, Seattle City Attorney, the Seattle City Council, the Seattle School Board and the Seattle Port Commission.

b. To offset production and distribution costs, participating candidates will be charged a fee of \$100 each. The fee would be waived for candidates who file for office by petition or who can show that at the time they were notified of the video production schedule their campaign fund did not contain \$100 that was not already obligated. Additional funding will be provided, as needed, from the budget of the King County Council, with the Council contribution not to exceed \$10,000.

- c. Production and distribution plans of the licensed video pamphlets shall be reviewed prior to distribution by the executive director of the Seattle Ethics and Elections

 Commission and the manager of the King County Division of Records and Elections to assure compliance to the extent possible with the laws and rules governing written voters' pamphlets.
- d. All candidates participating in the video will record their statements in the same studio setting and no editing will be performed to enhance any individual's statement.
- e. It will be the candidate's responsibility to select the take to be used in the video voters' pamphlet.
- f. The video voters pamphlet should be distributed as widely as possible. The public information plan should include efforts to gain distribution through libraries and cable and broadcast television systems throughout King County.
