A MOTION relating to regulatory notes

WHEREAS, in June, 1994, the council approved Motion 9319 establishing criteria to guide the development, review and adoption of regulatory ordinances and requesting the county executive to transmit a regulatory note with proposed regulatory ordinances, and

WHEREAS, the purposes of the regulatory note are to help ensure that the criteria contained in Motion 9319 are considered when a regulatory ordinance is being developed and to provide the council with an additional tool to evaluate a proposed regulatory ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the council has determined that accomplishing these purposes and effectively implementing Motion 9319 requires a definition of a "regulatory ordinance", a prescribed form for the regulatory note, and general rules for preparing and using regulatory notes;


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The council hereby approves the following definition of regulatory ordinance, for the purposes of implementing Motion 9319: A regulatory ordinance is an ordinance which:
- 1. If violated, subjects a person outside county employment to a civil or criminal penalty;
- 2. Subjects a person outside of county employment to the payment of a fee, which is used to implement a program promoting public safety, health and welfare;
- 3. Establishes, or adds to any existing procedure, practice or requirement or regulatory action;

- 4. Establishes, or adds to any existing qualifications or standards for the issuance, suspension or revocation of licenses to pursue any commercial activity, trade or profession; or
- 5. Establishes or places additional controls on development or land use activities, including, but not limited to, zoning ordinances, official controls, planned unit development ordinances, subdivision ordinances and binding site plan ordinances. (Quasi-judicial decisions concerning land use permit applications, however, are not regulatory.)
- B. The council hereby approves the attached regulatory note form for use in implementing Motion 9319.
- C. The council hereby approves the following general rules for the preparation and use of regulatory notes:
- 1. All proposed ordinances that meet the definition of regulatory ordinance as found in section A of this Motion should be accompanied by a regulatory note.
- 2. The executive should include a regulatory note along with any proposed regulatory ordinances transmitted to the council for review and approval. If the proposed regulatory ordinance is initiated by the council, a regulatory note should accompany the proposed ordinance when it is submitted to the clerk for introduction.
- 3. The council committee staff report for the proposed ordinance should include a copy of the regulatory note and committee staff comments on the regulatory note as necessary.
