PROJECT SUMMARY

1994 Operating Budget: \$2,020

Organization: Identifies, records, preserves, interprets, and displays the heritage of Vashon and Maury Islands. Long range goals include creating a heritage center to share the history of the Vashon-Maury Island community with the general public and to make available for public use the historical materials and information associated with Vashon and Maury Islands.

Project: The Harrington House was built in 1883 and is the last intact pioneer-era log house remaining on Vashon Island. In its early settlement years, Vashon's architecture consisted entirely of log buildings. Only Harrington House remains. The short term goal of the project is to stabilize the structure to prevent further deterioration, which has accelerated over the last year and now threatens the building's structural integrity. Without prompt action to save the house, future plans to restore it and establish a heritage museum on the site will be rendered moot.

Commission approval: based on Cultural Facilities Program 1994 Guide, Page 8, Urgent Need/Emergencies, criteria #4: "An imminent threat of loss or destruction of an historic property or resource." Commission fears that the opportunity to secure and preserve the building for public use will be forever lost.
