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A MOTION requesting the Executive to develop a fare reduction demonstration program to increase transit ridership.

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WHEREAS, annual vehicle miles traveled in King County have grown at a faster rate over the last two decades than population or employment, and

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WHEREAS, King County's freeway and arterial network is experiencing congestion at levels considered unacceptable only a few years ago, and

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WHEREAS, increased transit ridership is critical to any effort to address traffic congestion in King County, and

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WHEREAS, per capita ridership on fixed-route transit has declined over the past decade, and

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WHEREAS, a decreasing portion of all trips in King County are made using public transportation, and

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WHEREAS, the growth in car ownership and in two-car households means that fewer King County residents are dependent upon public transportation, and

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WHEREAS, the existing transit system has a significant amount of unused capacity, and

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WHEREAS, innovative methods, as well as ser improvements, are needed to encourage increased transit usage. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: The executive is requested to submit for council review a program to test the potential for increasing transit ridership by reducing weekend transit fares to twenty-five cents. Such a demonstration program should be of limited duration, beginning at the next feasible service change, and include the following elements: A. an estimate of increased ridership; B. an assessment of the implications, if any, of a reduced fare program upon service and vehicle availability; C. an estimate of revenue impact and implementation costs; D. a promotional strategy, and E. a follow-up evaluation.
