A MOTION requesting the executive to seek an agreement with the city of Seattle, the city of Kent and interested private entities for the purpose of preserving the Steel Lake Little League Fields and to provide economic development opportunities.

WHEREAS, the Seattle Solid Waste Utility has recently determined that properties they own known as the Kent Highlands landfill are surplus to their needs, and

WHEREAS, the parcels constitute about 202 acres of undeveloped land in which fourteen acres has been leased to the Steel Lake Little League since 1970, and

WHEREAS, The Steel Lake Little League has developed and currently operates six youth baseball fields on fourteen acres of the site under a year to year lease with the Seattle Solid Waste Utility, and,

WHEREAS, The lease between the Steel Lake Little League and the Seattle Solid Waste Utility will expire December 31, 1995, and

WHEREAS, The Seattle Solid Waste Utility has no plans to allow the Steel Lake Little League to use the existing fields even on a month to month basis after the lease expires, and
