MOTION NO.

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A MOTION authorizing free disposal of flood-related debris resulting from the flood event that began November 29, 1995.

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WHEREAS, King County experienced an unusually destructive flood event beginning November 29, 1995, causing significant damage to homes and other property, and

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WHEREAS, disposal of waste material resulting from the flood event at normal disposal fees would cause financial hardship for many property owners, and

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WHEREAS, all of King County will benefit from the cleanup of damage caused by the flood, and

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WHEREAS, the executive, on December 2, 1995, called for waived fees for the disposal of flood-related debris at County transfer facilities, initially those in the vicinity of the Snoqualmie and Skykomish rivers, including the Factoria and Houghton transfer stations and the Skykomish and Cedar Falls drop boxes, and

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WHEREAS, pursuant to K.C.C. 10.12.050B, emergency actions taken by the executive to waive fees that continue beyond the date of the next regularly scheduled council meeting require council approval by motion for continuation;

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NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County council hereby authorizes the executive to eliminate solid waste disposal fees for noncommercial haulers for flood-related debris related to damage from the flood event of November 29, 1995.

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B. These actions are authorized only through December 11, 1995. The executive shall report to the utilities and natural resources committee on December 7, 1995, regarding collection

2 need to continue the disposal fee waiver.
