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A MOTION confirming the King County Executive's proposal to conduct a strategic planning process for the regional emergency medical services system in cooperation with cities, fire districts, private industry, labor and the medical community.

WHEREAS, the King County emergency medical services system is internationally recognized for excellence, and

WHEREAS, the regional emergency medical services system is a partnership of King County, cities, fire districts, private ambulance providers and others, and

WHEREAS, the growth of managed care systems in the health care industry will present both challenges and opportunities to the current emergency medical services system, and

WHEREAS, addressing those challenges and taking advantage of opportunities will require a strengthening of the regional system, and

WHEREAS, authorization for the current countywide emergency medical services property tax levy ends in 1997, and

WHEREAS, reauthorization of the emergency medical services levy will need to occur in 1997 in order to assure continued operation of the regional service delivery system, and

WHEREAS, a strategic planning process would be an effective method for the county, cities, fire districts, labor, and medical community and private ambulance providers to evaluate the effect of changes in health care industry on the emergency medical service system, to make recommendations regarding respective public and private roles and 'responsibilities, and to establish a framework for reauthorization of the emergency medical services levy in 1997;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The establishment of an emergency medical services strategic planning process proposal by the county executive is hereby confirmed, including the appointment of a committee with representatives from cities, fire districts, labor, private ambulance providers,

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and the medical community to conduct the strategic planning process. The director of the Seattle King County department of public health or his designee shall serve as the chair of the 2 3 strategic planning committee. The emergency medical services strategic planning committee shall evaluate and make recommendations regarding: A. The respective roles and relationships of the public emergency medical service 6 providers and private sector providers in the King County emergency medical services system, 7 including the scope of public emergency medical service responsibilities to be funded by local 8 government through general or special taxes, such as the emergency medical services levy, 9 and services supported or provided by others; 10 B. Determining the desirability and feasibility of establishing linkages, between the 11 emergency medical services system and managed car providers and related health care 12 13 delivery systems; C. The establishment of a structure and means for the regional emergency medical 14 15 services system's interests to be collectively represented to managed care providers and 16 others.
