A MOTION authorizing continued free disposal of flood-related debris resulting from the flood event of November 29, 1995.

WHEREAS, King County experienced an unusually destructive flood event beginning November 29, 1995, causing significant damage to homes and other property, and

WHEREAS, disposal of waste material resulting from the flood event at normal disposal fees would cause financial hardship for many property owners, and

WHEREAS, all of King County will benefit from the cleanup of damage caused by the flood, and

WHEREAS, the executive, on December 2, 1995, called for waived fees for the disposal of flood-related debris at County transfer stations, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.C.C. 10.12.050B, actions taken by the executive to waive fees that continue beyond the date of the next regularly scheduled council meeting require council approval by motion for continuation, and

WHEREAS, by Motion No. 9717, the council of King County temporarily eliminated through December 11, 1995, solid waste disposal fees for flood-related debris from the storm on November 29, 1995, and

WHEREAS, there still exists a need for the disposal of storm debris;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County council hereby authorizes the Executive to eliminate solid waste disposal fees for noncommercial haulers for flood-related debris related to damage from the flood event of November 29, 1995.

2	December 17, 1995, at which time disposal fees and restrictions
3	shall return to normal.
