2 A MOTION authorizing continued free disposal
3 of flood-related debris resulting from the
4 flood event of November 29, 1995.

5 WHEREAS, King County experienced an unusually destructive
6 flood event beginning November 29, 1995, causing significant
7 damage to homes and other property, and

8 WHEREAS, disposal of waste material resulting from the flood
9 event at normal disposal fees would cause financial hardship for
10 many property owners, and

11 WHEREAS, all of King County will benefit from the cleanup of
12 damage caused by the flood, and

13 WHEREAS, the executive, on December 2, 1995, called for
14 waived fees for the disposal of flood-related debris at County
15 transfer stations, and

16 WHEREAS, pursuant to K.C.C. 10.12.050B, actions taken by the
17 executive to waive fees that continue beyond the date of the next
18 regularly scheduled council meeting require council approval by
19 motion for continuation, and

20 WHEREAS, by Motion No. 9717, the council of King County
21 temporarily eliminated through December 11, 1995, solid waste
22 disposal fees for flood-related debris from the storm on
23 November 29, 1995, and

24 WHEREAS, there still exists a need for the disposal of storm
25 debris;

26 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

27 A. The King County council hereby authorizes the Executive
28 to eliminate solid waste disposal fees for noncommercial haulers
29 for flood-related debris related to damage from the flood event
30 of November 29, 1995.

1 B. These actions are authorized to continue through
2 December 17, 1995, at which time disposal fees and restrictions
3 shall return to normal.

4 PASSED by a vote of 9 to 0 this 11th day of
5 December, 1995.
