Supported Employee Service Award

Purpose:

- A program providing a yearly recognition of Supported Employment Program (SEP) Employees.
- SEP is a King County Employment program. It provides jobs for severely disabled persons who have been excluded from the competitive work force. It seeks to provide; job development services, job placement services, training and orientation services and ongoing coaching services.
- The extra-ordinary nature of these individuals deserves yearly recognition.

Organizations Affected:

- All departments employing SEP Employees.
- Office of Human Resource Management (OHRM).

Guidelines:

- Employees will be presented, in a ceremony, an appropriate service award.
- The ceremonies will be conducted on a quarterly basis as stipulated by OHRM.
- Eligible employees will have completed a full year of service the prior quarter.
- SEP employees are also eligible for The King County Employees' Service Award Program.

Program Administrator:

- Office of Human Resource Management, administrators of The Supported Employment Program.
