WHEREAS, King County experienced unusually destructive flooding beginning February 8, 1996, causing significant damage to homes and other property, and

WHEREAS, the executive, on February 8, 1996 declared a flood emergency for King County, and

WHEREAS, disposal of waste material resulting from the flooding at normal disposal fees would cause financial hardship for many property owners, and

WHEREAS, all of King County will benefit from the cleanup of damage caused by the flooding, and

WHEREAS, the executive, on February 9, 1996, called for waived fees for the disposal of flood-related debris at County disposal sites beginning February 10, 1996, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.C.C. 10.12.050B, actions taken by the executive to waive fees that continue beyond the date of the next regularly scheduled council meeting require council approval by motion for continuation;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The King County council hereby authorizes the executive to eliminate solid waste disposal fees for noncommercial haulers for flood-related debris related to damage from the flood of February 8, 1996.
- These actions are authorized only through February 25, В. 1996. The executive shall report to the utilities and natural
