A MOTION establishing a phasing and financing plan for the creation of intercounty services under the provisions of the Six-Year Transit Development Plan

WHEREAS, the Six-Year Transit Development Plan for 1996-2001, approved by the King County council in December, 1995, called for the development of an intercounty services phasing and financing plan for review and recommendation by the Regional Transit Committee, and

WHEREAS, the King County Department of Transportation has presented a phasing and financing plan and the Regional Transit Committee has reviewed it, and

WHEREAS, the plan calls for instituting an interagency agreement with Community Transit and for the expenditure of approximately four percent of new service subsidy resources available in 1997 and 1998 toward the provision of intercounty service;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. In 1997 and 1998, approximately four percent of new service subsidy resources shall be devoted to the provision of intercounty service

 B. A reciprocal level of new service will be implemented by Community Transit during the same time frame. An interagency agreement will be developed by the King County Department of Transportation and Community Transit and approved before intercounty services planned for 1997 and 1998 are implemented.

- C. The service subsidy resources to be used 'for intercounty service in 1997 and 1998 shall come from the allocation to the west and east subareas of King County. No service subsidy resources for intercounty service shall be expended from the south King County subarea.
- D. The issue of the level of the intercounty fund and its possible application to other operators such as Pierce Transit, modifications to the plan for 1998, and its extension past 1997-98 shall be examined in the annual update process for the Six Year Transit Development Plan.

PASSED by a vote of 12 to 0 this 13th day of Qune, 1996.
