MOTION NO. 9883

A MOTION expressing intent to seek agreement with cities on a strategic framework for locally funded human services and to hold human services funding safe from disproportionate budget reductions while work progresses; and requesting support from the executive.

WHEREAS, in 1993 the King County council directed the King County children and family commission to review all of the county-funded programs for children, youth and families, and

WHEREAS, the commission found that the community services division of the department of community and human services had become the home to the majority of the county's discretionary human services programs and that these programs had developed in an ad hoc fashion with limited policy guidance and no provision for consistent planning and evaluation, and

21 WHEREAS, as a result of the commission's review and 22 recommendations, the council adopted Motion 9137 approving 23 planning guidelines for the community services division which 24 called for development of a strategic plan, and

25 WHEREAS, in December 1995 the executive submitted the 26 proposed Community Services Division Strategic Plan to the 27 Council for approval, and

28 WHEREAS, the strategic plan was referred to the law, 29 justice and human services committee, and

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WHEREAS, the stated intent of the proposed strategic plan is to provide a strategic framework for working in partnership with cities and other local funders to plan, coordinate and evaluate jointly-funded, community-based, human services programs, and

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WHEREAS, at the March 19, 1996 meeting of the law, justice and human services committee a number of service provider and suburban city representatives raised concerns about lack of involvement in development of the plan and potential disruption of existing services and relationships by the proposed new emphasis on prevention and on competitive contracting processes, and

WHEREAS, suburban cities representatives expressed particular concern that the county would apparently be changing its roles and responsibilities in regard to jointly funded human services prior to any effort to discuss the issue with its intended partners, and

WHEREAS, the Mayors of the Cities of Auburn and Bellevue each requested by letter that the council refer the plan and the issue of defining regional and local human services to an appropriate regional body, and

22 WHEREAS, the law, justice and human services committee 23 responded by voting at its April 2, 1996 meeting to refer 24 Proposed Motion 96-96, approving the Community Services 25 Strategic Plan, to the regional policy committee; 26 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King 27 County:

A. The King County council expresses its intent, via review by the regional policy committee of the Community Services Strategic Plan, to seek agreement with cities on a

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strategic framework for locally funded human services programs. The Community Services Strategic Plan proposes such a framework as a basis for implementing a collaborative, community-based program planning and review process and for initiating a process to determine which service areas would benefit most appropriately from different types of regional or local strategies.

B. The King County council further expresses its intent to hold discretionary human services funding safe from disproportionate reductions in the 1997 budget and to maintain current program funding policies, while work progresses on development and implementation of collaborative local/regional strategies.

C. The executive is hereby requested to help support the regional policy committee review process by providing representatives from the department of community and human services for the regional policy committee staff working group and by preparing a 1997 budget proposal in keeping with the intent expressed in Section B. above.
