2 A MOTION adopting the selection of
3 Ravensdale for the construction of a King County shooting
4 sports park.

6 WHEREAS, Ordinance 7341, adopted in 1985, approved funding for the
7 construction of King County shooting sports park, and

8 WHEREAS, construction of a King County shooting sports park would greatly
9 enhance officer training and safety as well as provide safe and affordable access for the
10 public, and

11 WHEREAS, over 40 different potential sites for the shooting sports park have been
12 considered over the past fifteen years by various siting committees, and

13 WHEREAS, the King County Council finds that the Final Environmental Impact
14 Statement (FEIS), published September 1993, which reviewed 7 different alternatives for
15 siting a King County shooting sports park, and the related June 1996 Addendum are
16 adequate for making a decision to site the police shooting range under the State
17 Environmental Policy Act (SEPA), and

18 WHEREAS, the King County Executive has carefully considered reasonable
19 alternatives for siting the King County shooting sports park and has thereupon designated
20 the King County Ravensdale site ("Ravensdale Site Alternative A") as the preferred
21 alternative;


22 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

23 The King County Council affirms selection of the Ravensdale site, Section
24 29, Township 22 North, Range 7 East, King County Washington, as the site for
25 construction of the King County shooting sports park. The shooting sports park shall be
26 limited to the northeast quadrant of the aforementioned property, and shall include training


1 facilities for King County Department of Public Safety personnel and shall include land
2 that can be leased to the Seattle Skeet and Trap Club and the Cascade Rifle and Pistol Club
3 for shooting facilities, subject to such limitations contained in leases to be executed with
4 those two clubs.

5 PASSED by a vote of 10 to 0 this 29th day of July, 1996.
