A MOTION authorizing the King County Department of Transportation to enter into agreements to comply with the terms of the vanpool budget proviso to provide 20 retired high quality vanpool vans, for the exclusive use by elderly and low-income citizens of King County.

WHEREAS, recipient organizations must participate in programs sponsored by local governments and non-profit organizations in King County and enter into an agreement with King County which requires them to defend and indemnify the county against liability, be sufficiently insured to support the indemnity and defense obligation, and the ability to maintain and operate the van for its remaining five year useful life, and

WHEREAS, the executive and council support the county's public transportation function by reducing single occupancy trips, thereby reducing pollution and traffic congestion; supplementing the services provided by the county's paratransit system; increasing mobility for the transit dependent for whom regular transit may not always be a convenient option, and

WHEREAS, executive and council staff collaboratively developed a list of social service agencies throughout the county based on specific selection criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The King County Department of Transportation has complied with the terms of Ordinance 11578 by facilitating the development of selection criteria, Exhibit A attached hereto, and supporting the consensus nomination process to determine eligible recipients identified in Exhibit B attached hereto.

King County 1996 Budget Ordinance Proviso

The transit program shall provide a maximum of 20 high quality retired 12 passenger vanpool vans, valued at \$200,000 for exclusive use by elderly and low-income citizens of King County participating in programs sponsored by local governments and non-profit organizations. The recipient program must enter into an agreement with King County which provides, among other things, to defend and indemnify the county against any liability, be sufficiently insured to support the indemnity and defense obligation, able to maintain and operate the van for its remaining five year useful life.

The Council finds that such provision of vans supports the Counties public transportation function by reducing single occupancy trips, thereby reducing pollution and traffic congestion; supplementing the services provided by the County's paratransit system; increasing mobility for the transit dependent for whom regular transit may not always be a convenient option.

Recipients of the program shall be approved annually by motion of the Council in accordance with the criteria and processed for selection of recipients as established by Council.



AGREEMENT between KING COUNTY and

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between King County, through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "County," and, hereinafter referred to as the "City."
WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of King County that trips using single occupancy vehicles (SOVs) be reduced; and
WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of King County that citizens have access to convenient transportation; and
WHEREAS, the County desires to assist in commencing transportation programs for their clients; and
WHEREAS, the City operates a center which provides services to citizens and, in connection therewith, is authorized to provide them with non-SOV transportation.
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:
I. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the County agrees to transfer title to, and possession of, a certain van bearing vehicle identification number to the City. Upon transfer of said van, the City will assume complete responsibility, at no cost to the County, for the operation and maintenance of said van, including but not limited to providing for its licensing, insurance, fuel, operations and maintenance.
II. Such van shall be provided on an "AS IS" and "WITH ALL FAULTS" basis. The County makes no warranties of any kind whatever, expressed or implied, as to said van, and all warranties, including any warranties or merchantability and fitness for any particular purpose, are hereby disclaimed and excluded. The City acknowledges and agrees that it accepts the above disclaimer and waiver and further agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officials, employees, agents and contractors from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, liabilities or costs of whatsoever kind and nature which arise out of or are in any way limited to claims against the County which are brought by employees or former employees of the City and, by mutual negotiation, the City hereby waives, as respects the County only, any immunity that would otherwise be available against such claims under the workers' compensation provisions of Title 51 RCW. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the terms of this section shall survive any termination of this Agreement.
