A MOTION establishing a citizen's oversight panel to evaluate Renton and Highline school-linked health centers.

WHEREAS, the 1997 King County adopted budget contains funding to begin two school-linked health centers in the Renton and Highline school districts, and

WHEREAS, the overall goal of the school-linked health centers is to increase the access of adolescents to health services, and

WHEREAS, a proviso in the 1997 budget ordinance states the council's intent to review the school-linked health centers in Renton and Highline in the fall of 1998 to determine whether the health centers merit continued county support, and

WHEREAS, the proviso requires the council to establish a citizen's oversight panel to work with the director of the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health to conduct an evaluation of the effectiveness of the health centers, and

WHEREAS, the proviso also requests the citizen's oversight panel to work with the public health director to

establish criteria for the evaluation, including, but not be limited to, community support for the health centers and the availability and sufficiency of appropriate funding, and to prepare a report for the council summarizing the results of the evaluation, and

WHEREAS, the public health director has appointed volunteer citizens to community advisory committees in Renton and Highline to, among other things, help determine the services to be offered at their respective health centers and develop policies to address issues such as parental involvement and ongoing community participation, and

WHEREAS, the citizen's oversight panel appointed by the council should consult with the community advisory committees regarding its selection of evaluation criteria;
