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2 A MOTION establishing a citizen's
3 oversight panel to evaluate Renton and
4 Highline school-linked health centers.
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6 WHEREAS, the 1997 King County adopted budget contains
7 funding to begin two school-linked health centers in the
8 Renton and Highline school districts, and

9 WHEREAS, the overall goal of the school-linked health
10 centers is to increase the access of adolescents to health
11 services, and

12 WHEREAS, a proviso in the 1997 budget ordinance states
13 the council's intent to review the school-linked health
14 centers in Renton and Highline in the fall of 1998 to
15 determine whether the health centers merit continued county
16 support, and

17 WHEREAS, the proviso requires the council to establish a
18 citizen's oversight panel to work with the director of the
19 Seattle-King County Department of Public Health to conduct an
20 evaluation of the effectiveness of the health centers, and

21 WHEREAS, the proviso also requests the citizen's
22 oversight panel to work with the public health director to

1 establish criteria for the evaluation, including, but not be
2 limited to, community support for the health centers and the
3 availability and sufficiency of appropriate funding, and to
4 prepare a report for the council summarizing the results of
5 the evaluation, and

6 WHEREAS, the public health director has appointed
7 volunteer citizens to community advisory committees in Renton
8 and Highline to, among other things, help determine the
9 services to be offered at their respective health centers and
10 develop policies to address issues such as parental
11 involvement and ongoing community participation, and

12 WHEREAS, the citizen's oversight panel appointed by the
13 council should consult with the community advisory committees
14 regarding its selection of evaluation criteria;

15 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King
16 County:

17 1. The council hereby establishes a school-linked
18 health centers citizen's oversight panel and appoints the
19 following individuals to the panel:

14 2. The council hereby requests the citizen's oversight
15 panel, by May 1, 1997, to submit for council review and
16 approval a proposed plan for evaluating the effectiveness of
17 the school-linked health centers, including the proposed
18 evaluation criteria.

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3. The council hereby requests the citizen's oversight panel to submit its evaluation report to the council by August 15, 1998, so that the results of the evaluation may be used by the council to help determine whether county support for the health centers should be continued in the 1999 budget.
