MOTION NO. 10197

A MOTION requesting the executive to conduct a feasibility study toward the implementation of a non-emergency 311 access system and enhancing wireless emergency communication to complement the enhanced emergency 911 program.

WHEREAS, February 19, 1997 the Federal Communications Commission set aside 311 across the nation as the telephone number for people to call to access police or other local agencies for non-emergency help, and,

WHEREAS, Baltimore, Maryland has implemented a 311 nonemergency number as a pilot project due to severe overloading of their 911 system, and,

WHEREAS, although King County's regional E-911 currently provides excellent service to the citizens of King County, increases in E-911 calls due to population growth are

projected, and there are inappropriate calls made to 911 that are informational or non-emergency in nature, and,

WHEREAS, approximately 318,000 911 calls were made from wireless phones in King County in 1996, and,

WHEREAS, 80% - 90% of wireless users buy their phones for safety reasons, and the lower cost of wireless service continually increases the number of wireless phones in use, potentially increasing emergency telephone activity, and

WHEREAS, currently wireless phones are unable to provide location information on 911 calls which jeopardizes the safety of the public, and

WHEREAS, in June 1996 the Federal Communications

Commission established rules governing wireless 911 location implementation, and

WHEREAS, the emergency 911 number is a vital tool in allowing citizens to access emergency services and it is important to proactively plan for system expansion to ensure access to this critical service;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The executive, in conjunction with the Regional PSAP (Public Safety Answering Point)Committee, the suburban cities, and the city of Seattle, is directed to conduct a feasibility study and prepare a fiscal note to determine if the implementation of a 311 non-emergency telephone access

system in King County would be beneficial in reducing the 1 2 number of inappropriate calls to 911. The feasibility study and fiscal note shall be presented to the Regional Policy 3 Committee for review no later than September 30, 1997; then 4 5 to the Budget and Fiscal Management Committee for budget In addition, the Enhanced 911 Program Office shall 6 concurrently present a report on the planned enhancements to 7 the E-911 system as it relates to wireless emergency 911 8 services, including wireless call location identification. 9 PASSED by a vote of 2 to 0 this 28th day of 10 pril , 19<u>97</u>. 11 KING COUNTY COUNCIL 12
