• Sound Recovery Center Sleep-Off Facility Operation

Review the contract with and the protocols utilized by the Sound Recovery Center in its operation of a "sleep-off" facility.

1997 PROPOSED AUDITOR'S OFFICE WORK PROGRAM

CARRIED OVER FROM 1996

• DDES Waiver of Permit Fees

Review policies, procedures, and practices related to DDES waiver of permit fees.

• Criminal Justice Funding

Determine whether criminal justice funds designated to hire new police officers were spent for that purpose.

Animal Control Revenue

Determine whether animal control revenues are being appropriately collected and that related internal controls are adequate.

Jail Overtime

Review spending on overtime to determine whether overtime expenditures are increasing or decreasing. Also determine the department's status in reviewing the use of part-time corrections officers.

DDES Grading Function

Review and evaluate the DDES response to complaints of grading code violations, effectiveness of referral to Code Enforcement for administrative processing of sanctions, e.g., notice and order (to comply/correct), assessment of civil penalties, and success in achieving compliance.

County Agency Coordination on Capital Improvement Projects

Evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of coordination between-County agencies on capital improvement projects.

• Interlocal Agreements

Compare the terms of interlocal agreements actually executed with those adopted by the Council to see if they are substantially in the same form.

• Review of Capital Projects Financed by King County Bonds

Review the status of capital projects financed by King County Bonds (e.g., Woodland Park Zoo, Harborview Medical Center, Regional Justice Center, Open Space, etc.) to determine if project activities are consistent with voter mandates as well as project budgets and schedules.

• King County Employee Benefits

Review the King County employee benefits program to determine whether the Office of Human Resource Management has fully implemented the benefits program; County employees are knowledgeable about the range of available benefits; the extent to which County employees utilize the available benefits, and the competitiveness of the benefits program in attracting and retaining high caliber County employees.

Fire Marshal Fees

Review the basis for and assessment of fire marshal fees.

Domestic Violence Cases

Determine the types of issues, if any, impeding the prosecution of domestic violence cases and develop solutions to the issues identified.

• Automated Telephone Systems Impact on Customer Service

Review automated telephone systems used by County agencies to identify access problems that citizens might encounter.

• Temporary Contract Worker Follow-Up

Follow up the 1995 temporary contract worker audit to determine the current usage of contract workers and whether recommendations have been implemented.

Metro/King County Consolidation

Review and evaluate the results of the Metro/King County consolidation to determine if consolidation has actually occurred.

COUNCIL REQUESTED 1997

• Office of Civil Rights Enforcement

Review complaints filed with the Office of Civil Rights Enforcement to determine how long the complaint disposition process takes and whether the length of time is reasonable.

• Department of Construction & Facilities Management

The objective of this study is to determine whether the assumptions used to justify combining the Department of Construction and Facilities Management and the Facilities Management Division into an internal service fund have been realized.

• Transit Vehicle Maintenance

Review and evaluate transit vehicle maintenance procedures and practices.

• Surface Water Management

Evaluate the six-year financial plan and its effect on staffing, organization and allocation of costs. Also review future service boundary adjustments due to annexations and incorporations and the growth management act, and programming coordination with other jurisdictions.

• Information and Telecommunications Services

Evaluate the efficiency and economy of planned technology investments and the operating impact of their implementation.

STAFF SUGGESTED 1997

County Fair Follow-Up

Conduct a review of the implementation of audit recommendations from the 1995 audit, including food vendor contracts, carnival contract, procedures over concessionaires/exhibitors and completion of various other written procedures. Also, conduct a general review of the result of the 1996 Fair.

• Public Safety Communications Center and E-911 Program

Review the Department of Public Safety Communications Center and E-911 Program to determine whether operations are effective and efficient and whether the utilization of E-911 revenues is consistent with voter mandates.

Sunset Review of Capital Project Funds

Review CIP funds to determine the need to continue funds where the original purpose of the funds has been fulfilled.

• Fixed Asset System

Review the implementation of the fixed asset system to ensure that appropriate accounting information is being produced and that the needs of County agencies are met.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AUDITS

• Harborview Medical Center

Evaluate construction management practices related to the Harborview Medical Center project.

Regional Justice Center

Evaluate construction management practices related to the Regional Justice Center project.

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NON-AUDIT PROJECT

• Performance Measures

Monitor executive branch development of performance measures and selectively verify data for such measures.
