Odyssey, The Maritime Discovery Center. Summary Program Plan

Organizational Description: Odyssey, the Maritime Discovery Center, is an educational facility located on the central Seattle waterfront and dedicated to promoting a greater understanding and awareness of the maritime resources of King County and the Puget Sound region. The center has as its primary mission the education of children, young people and adults through exhibits, hands-on interactive displays, and other program opportunities that explore the natural, economic and community resources associated with the Puget Sound.

<u>Program Plan</u>: Odyssey is in the final phase of constructing a permanent home at Pier 66 on Elliot Bay. The \$14.2 million facility will include 33,000 square feet and feature 50 hands-on exhibits. Visitors to the center will have an opportunity to learn about maritime wonders in three thematic galleries:

- Ocean Trade looks at our working harbors and the features that make the Puget Sound a major international gateway to trade and commerce
- Harvesting the Sea explores the adventure of the places where fish are found, how to catch them, consume them and sustain them
- Sharing the Sound is full of exhibits about the activities that take place on, around, or beneath the Puget Sound

King County Outreach Plan: The goal of Odyssey is to reach the widest audience of residents and visitors to the region, with a primary focus on serving the young people of King County. In order to involve the greatest number of students, Odyssey is working with all 19 King County school districts to develop special educational services for students in schools ranging from Seattle to Lake Washington, from Northshore to Federal Way. In addition, the center will regularly offer special King County student admissions in conjunction with educational programming at Odyssey.

Expenditure Timeline: The King County Council's contribution of \$95,500 will be used in Spring, 1997, to help support completion of educational exhibit design and fabrication, to be installed in the three galleries described above. With this support, Odyssey will have raised over \$8.6 million and will raise the remaining \$5.6 million through additional private and public contributions between now and July, 1998, when Odyssey will officially open its doors to the young people and residents of the Puget Sound.
